National Harvest Festival September 13th – October 27th, 2012

Silver Dollar City's "National Harvest Festival," running from September 13 through October 27, is a sure sign that Fall is in the air as our beautiful Ozark Hills start to burst into their Fall colors along with one of the largest gatherings of American artists and craftsmen. The National Harvest Festival is a true celebration of American craftsmanship illustrating why Silver Dollar City is called "The Home of American Craftsmanship."



On a typical day Silver Dollar City has Master Craftsmen demonstrating a number of crafts such as glassblowing, candle making, pottery making, culinary arts and many more. During the National Harvest Festival over 130 additional visiting craftsmen from all over the country join them to demonstrate their art or craft. These range from painting to Native American flutes, knife making, pumpkin carving and the "Made In Missouri Juried Exhibit & Sale" featuring "Best of Missouri Hands Artists" and many more. It is truly a unique opportunity to experience American craftsmanship as most people have never had a chance to do.

An Old Time Christmas November 3rd - December 30th, 2012

The traditional celebration of Christmas is an inherent part of "Ozark Mountain Christmas" and nowhere is that more evident than at Silver Dollar City's "An Old Time Christmas". It is an award winning spectacle filled with millions of sparkling lights, great shows, excitement, fun and pageantry that was named as one of the top Christmas destinations in America by both CNN.Com and ABC's "Good Morning America."

An Old Time Christmas transforms the 1880s-style theme park into a glowing Christmas extravaganza with over four million lights sparkling throughout the park. The focal point of the celebration is in Silver Dollar City's square, which is the setting for "Christmas on Main Street," one of the biggest and most spectacular light shows ever.

Its centerpiece is a 5-Story Special Effects Christmas Tree. It comes to life each day at dusk playing Christmas music such as "Carol of the Bells," "Joy to the World," "Suite from Polar Express" and more as its many colored Christmas lights sparkle, twinkle and dance along with the one million lights covering the surrounding City square area. The "Gifts of Christmas Holiday Light Parade," with over 100,000 lights, passes through the park and City Square twice each evening, if the weather permits, and is a breathtaking sight when combined with the lights of the tree and surrounding square.



With its bow slicing through water, Titanic soars 100 feet above Hwy 76, stopping traffic. Guests have expressed this as a "must see" family attraction in Branson. It's "Awesome" visitors say. A ninety-minute, interactive walk through history:

- Arrive shipside through a scaled version of the London Waterloo Train Station
- Enter Titanic through an iceberg
- Receive a boarding pass from uniformed crew members
- Explore 2 decks filled with more than 400 priceless artifacts once belonging to Titanic passengers or crew
- Walk the Grand Staircase from a Third Class cabin to a First Class suite
- Touch an iceberg and see how long you can hold your hand in water chilled to 28 degrees - the temperature some passengers had to endure
- Try to send an SOS message or shovel coal into a Titanic furnace
- Sit in a full size lifeboat and listen to true stories of survivors

Titanic's Rose Petal Ceremony

In the Memorial Room, you'll pick a real rose petal then place it in a magnificent glass case as you exit. The Rose Petal Tribute will end April 1, 2012 when all the rose petals will be shipped to the United States Coast Guard. When the Titanic reaches her centennial next April, the USGG International Ice Patrol will release the petals – millions of them – at sea, at the site Titanic slipped away around April 14, 2012.

Titanic Branson will host the National Ice Carving Association's (NICA) 2012 National Ice Carving Competition, an annual two-day, pre-Olympic marathon that pits carvers against each other in a winner-take-all showdown. Contestants will use chainsaws, chisels, blowtorches, and their imaginations, to create masterworks of frozen art. Held in Titanic's outdoor exhibit area, the event will be judged by NICA members.

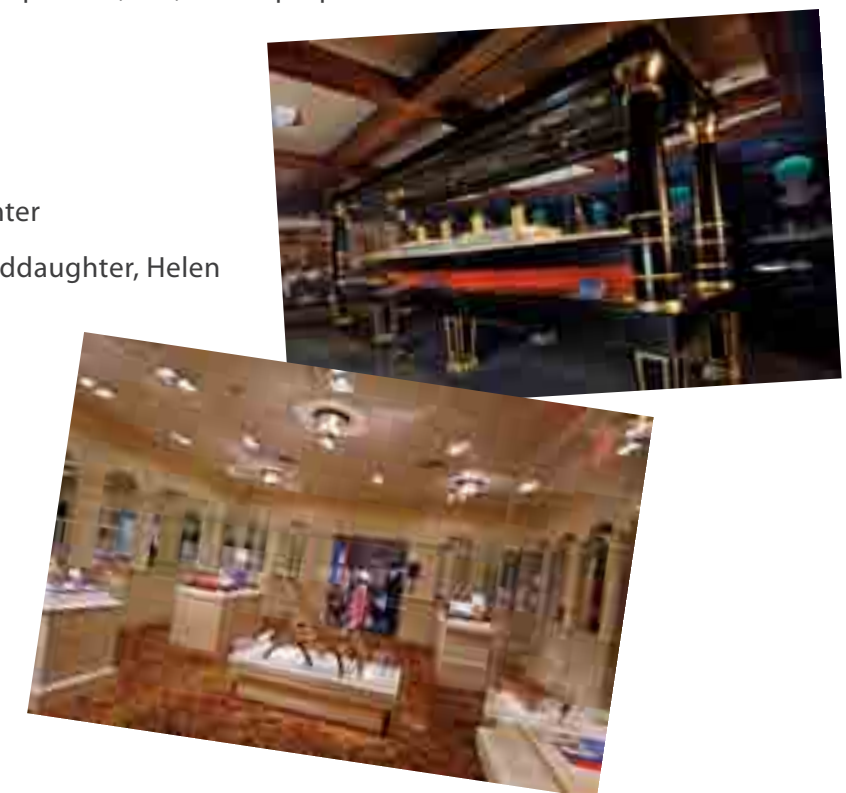
Sweet Treats with Titanic's Molly & Carter

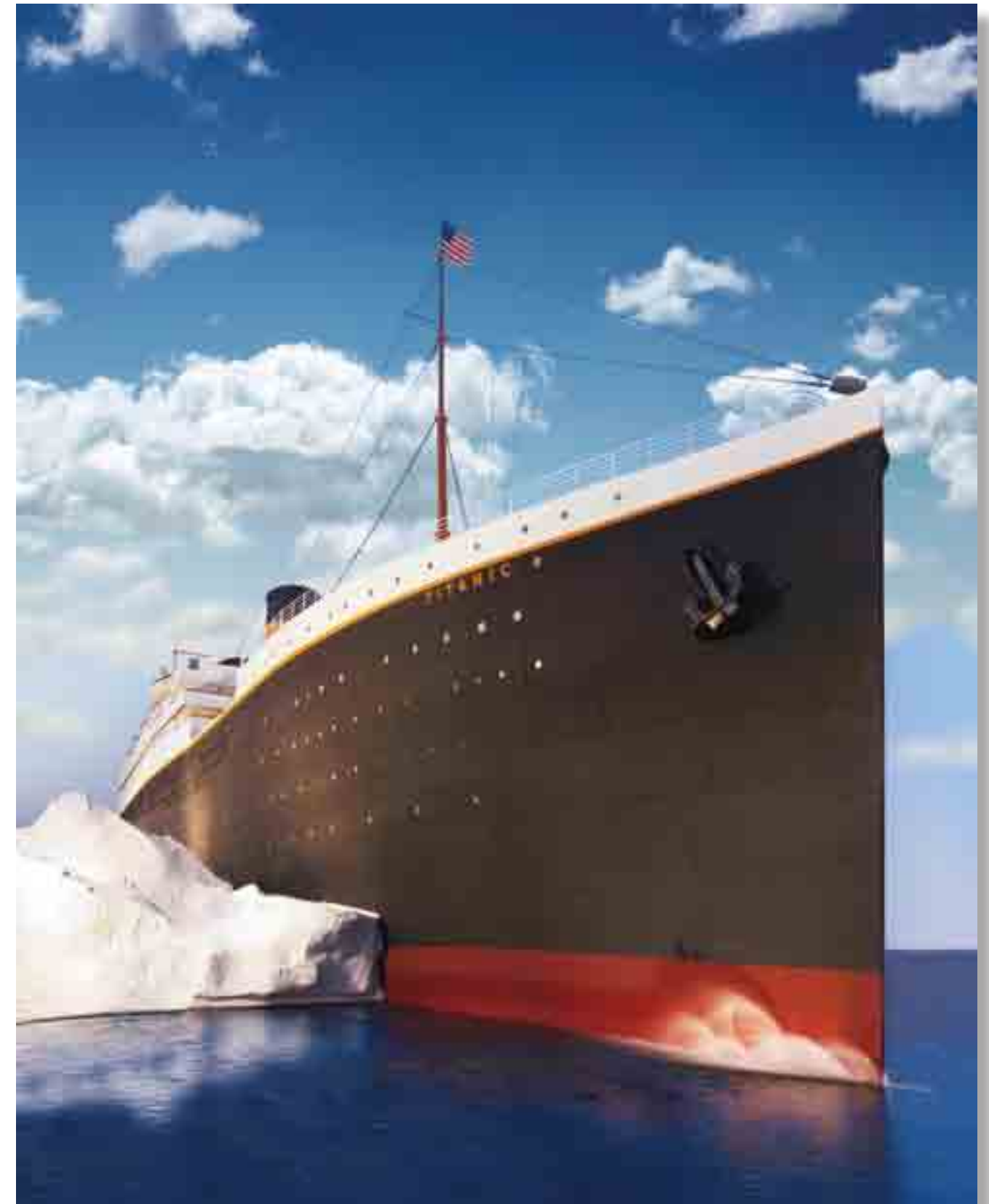

Ralph Foster Museum at College of the Ozarks

Ralph Foster Museum on the campus of the College of the Ozarks grew from humble beginnings in the 1920s to become one of the Midwest's foremost institutions of historical preservation. The primary focus of the Ralph Foster Museum today is to collect, preserve, interpret and exhibit items relating to the Ozarks region. One of the more famous exhibits is the original vehicle used in the television series "The Beverly Hillbillies". In addition, visitors will find antiques, weapons, dolls, natural history and other items from around the world.



Shepherd of the Hills Trout Hatchery

The Shepherd of the Hills Trout Hatchery is operated by the Missouri Department of Conservation and produces both Rainbow and Brown Trout for not only Lake Taneycomo but other state trout fishing facilities. The Visitor Center features a display of wildflowers and plants indigenous to the area as well as a nature display and a short video on the hatchery and the process of producing the trout that makes Lake Taneycomo one of the premier trout fisheries in the nation. There is also a huge aquarium with some "lunker" Brown and Rainbow Trout indicating the size of some of the trout in Lake Taneycomo. The Visitor Center opens at 9:00 a.m. every day except, Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Years Day.





Branson Auto Museum

The Branson Auto Museum features over 100 cool cars inside and 15-20 outside. All of the outside cars are for sale and many of the inside cars are also for sale. Museum cars and inventory change regularly, so be sure to come back when you return to the area. The Old Toys and More toy store has an incredible display of rare and unusual toys, pedal cars, trains and many more. Joe's Rod Shop has all of your hotrod parts and accessories.



Branson Landing Cruises - Lake Queen

The Lake Queen is a modern day replica of the grand riverboats which used to ply the White River in Branson, Missouri. As the Lake Queen paddles along the shores of Lake Taneycomo, your guide will explain facts and trivia of the historical and present day Branson waterfront, along with local points of interest.



Branson Landing Princess - Sightseeing

Shepherd of the Hills Homestead

The Shepherd of the Hills Homestead is a unique blend of Ozarks History and down-home fun. Guests of all ages enjoy historical tours, craftsmen, music, and breathtaking views from the 230-foot Inspiration Tower. In 1996, the play was performed for the 5,000th time, making it the longest-running outdoor drama ever.



Shepherd of the Hills Inspiration Tower

Inspiration Tower is Branson's "landmark on the horizon" -- a massive 230' tall structure located on Inspiration Point in The Shepherd of the Hills Homestead. Constructed and erected in 1989, it weighs 3 million pounds, cost approximately \$1.5 million to build, contains over 92,000 pounds of structural steel, and can withstand a constant wind of 172 mph or gusts of up to 224 mph! The Tower also contains over 4,400 square feet of glass - enough to cover a third of a football field!



Shoot for the Stars Mini Golf

Trail of Lights

With an 18-year Heritage of Holiday Magic, The Trail of Lights is a drive-thru animation display that will carry you into the very heart of Christmas. The Trail winds its way through the historic 160-acre Shepherd of the Hills homestead, and will take you down the famous "Trail that Nobody Knows How Old" into a holiday wonderland.



Veterans Memorial Museum

The Veterans Memorial Museum in Branson is a national tribute to the brave men and women who defended our liberties during the 20th Century. A visit to the museum is a powerful, emotional experience. You'll be captivated by the stories of these men and women who gave us so much.



Vigilante Zipline

An exciting new thrill ride! The ZipRider zip line cable is based on the familiar concept of the back yard zip line but then turns that fun experience into an exciting, no-worries ride. The key lies in the ZipRider trolley, a device designed to automatically brake while the rider descends cable gradients ranging from 5%-40%. The Vigilante ZipRider will carry guests downhill 1/2 a mile across the historic 160 acre homestead at speeds reaching 50 mph!



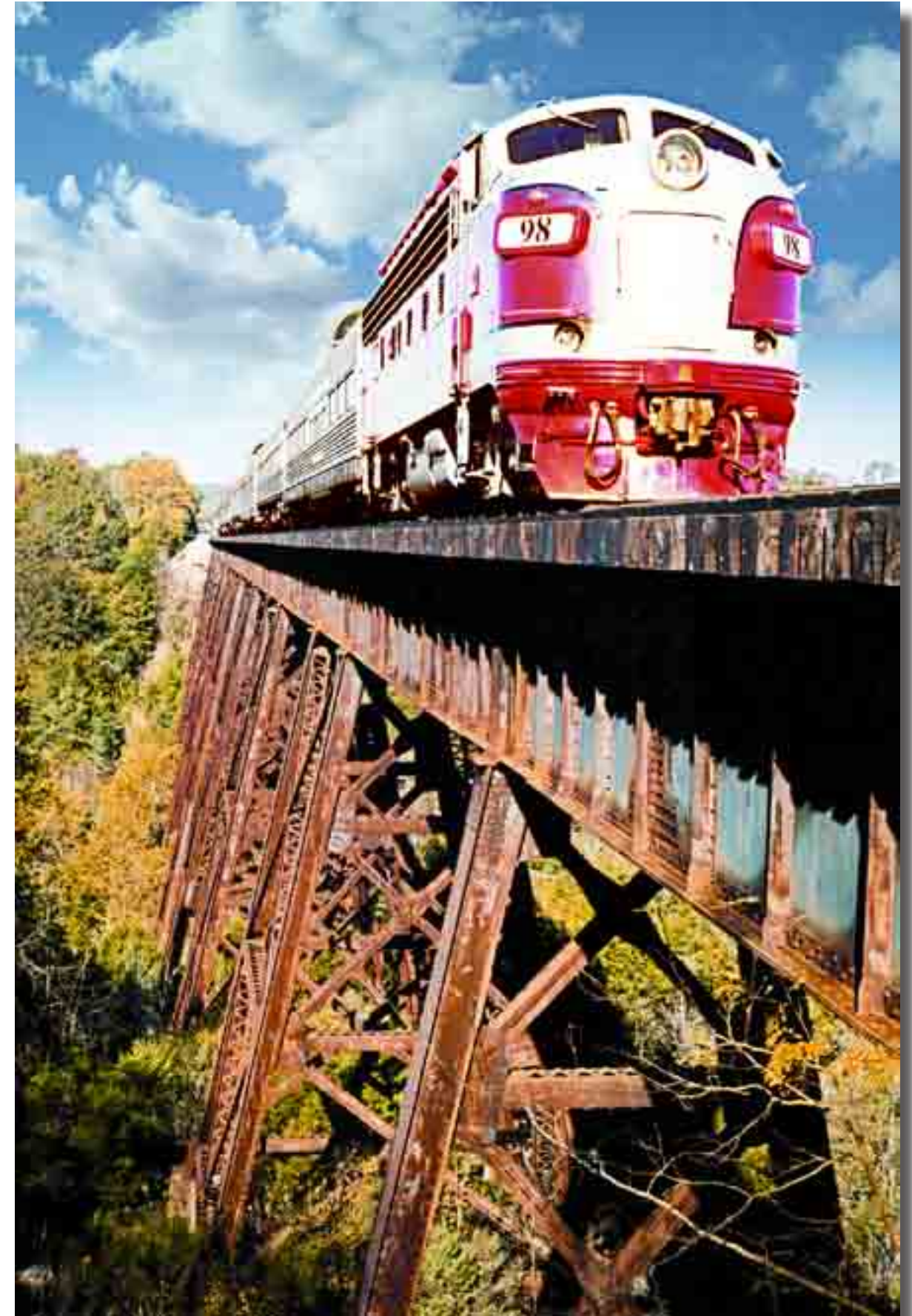
White Water

The convention center offers a wide range of services, including complete onsite catering, top tier audio visual services, Internet, event management, a business center and a single point of contact for all services. The convention center also connects directly to the Hilton Branson Convention Hotel, a 12-story luxury hotel with **290 rooms and suites**.

The Branson Convention Center and the Hilton Branson Convention Center Hotel are elements of Branson Landing a \$420 million public/private project spanning 1.5 miles of Lake Taneycomo adjacent to historic downtown Branson. The project, opened officially in the Summer of 2006 and includes **450,000 square feet** of retail shops and restaurants-including Bass Pro Shops and Belk department store, condominiums, a boardwalk, marinas, entertainment, parking and an additional Hilton property, the Hilton Promenade at Branson Landing.
